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A. BACKGROUND

The Minister of Education and Culture through Permendikbud No. 3 of 2020 concerning National Standards for Higher Education stipulates the Independent Learning-Independent Campus (MBKM) Policy. This policy gives students the right to have the opportunity to study outside of university. It is hoped that through the MBKM program, students will be better prepared to face rapid social, cultural, work world, and technological advances. As a form of autonomous and flexible learning in higher education, MBKM is expected to be able to create an innovative, non-restrictive learning culture that is in accordance with student needs. Through this program, there are wide opportunities for students to enrich and improve their insights and competencies in the real world in accordance with their passion for learning and their ideals.

B. OVERVIEW FROM 2022-2024

The Psychology undergraduate program includes a formal internship course within its curriculum. Internship is an elective course that can be converted to 20 credits. The course conversion for the internship can be seen in the table below:




Internship Program

C. MBKM ACTIVITIES OF PSYCHOLOGY STUDY PROGRAM I

Mention and explain the MBKM scheme carried out by the study program. MBKM scheme options include:

1. Student exchange

Student exchange is an academic activity, where students have the right to take courses across study programs, or across universities that can be converted to be equivalent to a maximum of 20 credits. Student exchange is carried out for a period of one semester, according to the academic calendar of the study program or the student's destination university. The registration and implementation period is held twice, namely in the odd semester and even semester. The implementation stages in the MBKM Student Exchange include:

- Audience with partners regarding academic calendar and courses offered
- Convert courses and credits together with the curriculum team
- Socialization to students
- Registration
- Selection and announcement of successful students
- Implementation of lectures
- Mid-term and final exams
- Preparation of reports and completeness of supporting evidence
- Collection of values from study programs or partner universities
- Evaluation and feedback from study programs or partner universities, course lecturers, and students.

MBKM Internship is an academic activity that can be an option for students equivalent to 20 credits of courses carried out outside the campus as a medium for students to gain real experience in the industrial world. Implementation for 1 semester in the odd semester which is divided into a minimum of 3 months going down to the field at the partner and the remaining 3 months doing activities on campus for the guidance process, preparing reports, and disseminating internship results. While students are doing their internship at the partner, working hours must be met for a minimum of 20 hours and a maximum of 40 hours.

MBKM Research is an academic research activity, both science and social humanities, which is carried out under the supervision of lecturers or researchers at units under UB or research institutions such as LIPI/BRIN, NASA, to universities outside UB. Research is a form of learning activity to build critical thinking in students who have the desire to become researchers to further explore, understand, and carry out research methods better. MBKM Research activities will be carried out for 600 hours or equivalent to 20 credits and are carried out for 1 semester. The stages of implementation in MBKM Research include:

- Handover of students from the supervising lecturer to the partner
- Implementation of research and guidance

Running in 2023

The MBKM Humanitarian Project is implemented under the PKKM program held in 2023. The MBKM Humanitarian Project was developed to accommodate student learning activities directly in the community or disaster-affected community. The program allows students to learn to identify problems in the community or partners and develop solutions based on scientific evidence and provides students with the opportunity to apply their knowledge so that it can be directly useful in the community and in the world of work. In the first year (PKKM) the implementation of the MBKM Humanitarian Project will focus on psychosocial assistance for survivors in disaster-affected areas. This assistance activity will begin with identifying needs and field situations, the results of which will then form the basis for compiling the MBKM Humanitarian Project guidelines.

The following are the stages of implementing the MBKM Humanitarian Project.

- Focus group discussions to identify needs and field situations, both in the MBKM Humanitarian Project. The output of this activity is the design of the MBKM Humanitarian Project PS S1 Psychology. In this activity we collaborate with the Indonesian Psychology Student Association (HIMPSI) and the Clinical Psychology Association (IPK).
- Workshop on preparing the MBKM guideline for Humanitarian Projects. The output of this activity is the RPS and MBKM Module for Humanitarian Projects.
- Provision of preparation for the implementation of the MBKM Humanitarian Project. The output of this activity is the readiness of the competencies of students involved in the MBKM Humanitarian Project.
- Implementation of MBKM Humanitarian Project. The output of this activity is the number of students who participate in the MBKM Humanitarian Project which is equivalent to 20 credits.
- Evaluation of the implementation of the MBKM Humanitarian Project. The output of this activity is feedback from students, lecturers, and partners/stakeholders that can be used to improve the implementation of the MBKM Humanitarian Project in the following year.

H. THE ROLE OF FACULTY, DEPARTMENT, AND STUDY PROGRAMS, AND SUPERVISING LECTURERS IN MBKM ACTIVITIES

Faculty

The Faculty has roles including:

- 1. Directing the preparation and/or development of curriculum innovations by adapting the MBKM implementation model.
- Appointing and assigning MBKM Management Units at faculty/PSDKU level
- 3. Prepare a list of relevant courses for Faculty level conversion and register with the University MBKM Management Unit.
- 4. Identify potential strategic partners to support MBKM and initiate collaboration.
- 5. Preparing cooperation documents (MoA/PKS) with strategic partners, both educational institutions and entities outside of higher education.
- 6. Prepare technical guidelines and SOPs for implementing MBKM at the Faculty level.
- Assigning Supervising Lecturers/Supervisors for each form of MBKM learning activity based on proposals from the Department/Study Program.
- 8. Providing socialization and special training that supports the role and function of Supervising Lecturers and MBKM Partner Supervisors.
- 9. Provide validation of inbound and outbound student data.
- 10. Reporting the activity equivalence result values to PDDIKTI.

Departments and Study Programs Departments have the following roles:

- 1. Initiating MBKM activity collaboration with strategic partners or other universities.
- 2. Conduct periodic evaluation of the eligibility of MBKM Partners/Programs.
- 3. Together with the Curriculum Team, compile and/or develop curriculum innovations by adapting the MBKM implementation model.

- Compiling a list of Study Program Courses that can be taken by students outside the Study Program within Brawijaya University and outside Brawijaya University.
- Compiling and determining the equivalence of courses and credits for BKP MBKM activities followed by each student.
- 6. In the case of implementing MBKM from a Program outside the Department/Study Program, provide consideration to the students concerned regarding credit recognition to ensure that the MBKM learning plan meets 20 credits in 1 (one) semester.
- 7. Propose Supervisors and Examiners for each student who carries out BKP MBKM activities.
- 8. Facilitating Supervisors in the monitoring process of MBKM implementation.
- 9. Conducting a recap of student data that carries out MBKM activities.
- 10. Propose Supervisors and Examiners for each student who carries out BKP MBKM activities.
- 11. In the case of a shortage or excess of 20 credits of MBKM activities, the Study Program can prepare another mechanism by coordinating with the Faculty's Academic Section which can be utilized by MBKM student participants.

Academic Supervisor and/or MBKM Supervisor

The Supervisor is an Academic Supervisor or lecturer assigned as a supervisor for students who carry out MBKM activities, with roles including the following:

- 1. Providing considerations for planning BKP MBKM activities.
- 2. Carrying out guidance on the implementation of BKP MBKM activities.
- 3. Carrying out guidance on the preparation of BKP MBKM activity reports.

- 4. Monitoring students in BKP MBKM activities.
- 5. Conduct evaluations with field supervisors and examiners. Evaluations can be in the form of student processes and activities, as well as partner relevance.
